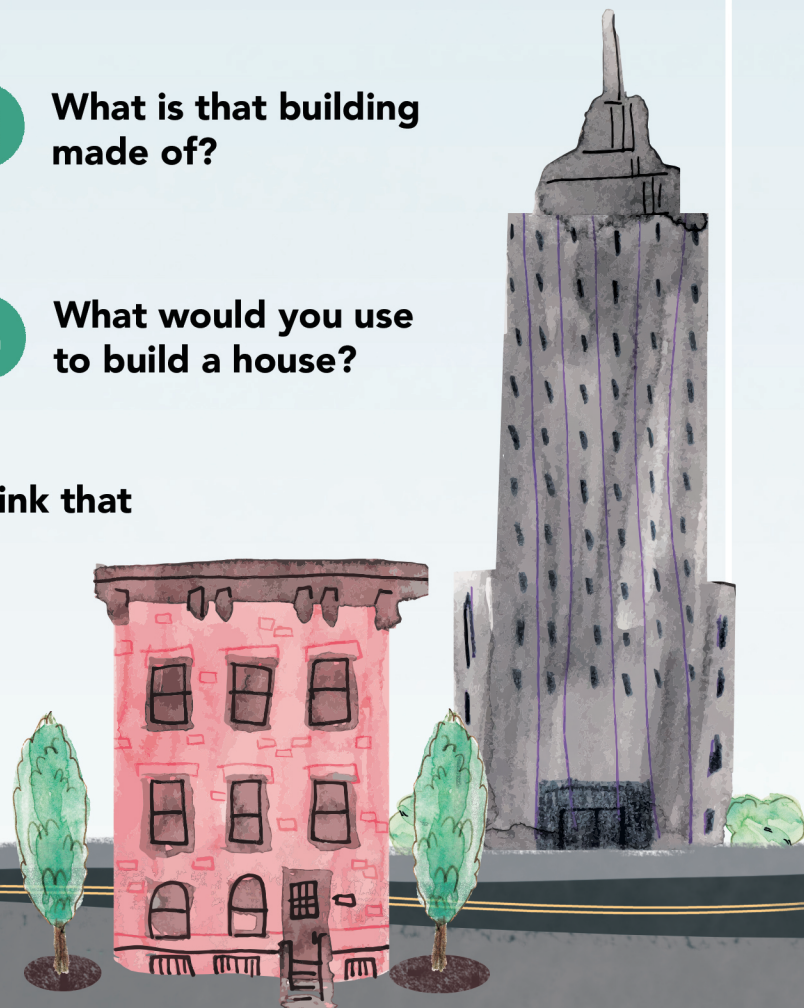
How does that bridge stay up?
